for at least one full year.

Remarks: Foreigners must possess a resident visa stamped on their passport at the nearest Dominican

Consulate. They must obtain a residence permit when they arrive in the country before clearance can be performed. Dominican citizens only need to present their passport but they

must have been out of the country for at least one year.

Remarks: Most Dominican Consulates will require the OBL/AWB and a commercial invoice to issue the

invoice. Since household goods and used cars will not have an invoice, you can make a commercial invoice in your own stationary showing marks, description, weight and value of
